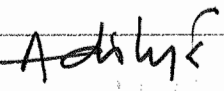

My primary focus is ensuring comprehensive social security and financial stability for all the fellow members. In my opinion the Bar must push for a robust and more inclusive scheme for retired practitioners and also establish emergency financial assistance funds. Improving pan gender basic courtroom facilities, enhancing library access, and creating subsidized transit options seems like an imperative need of the hour looking at the new age of dawn that we are now entering.

2)Chamber allotment

Chamber allotment must be strictly transparent, merit-based, and heavily reliant on seniority while reserving equitable quotas for women and differently-abled advocates. The current waiting lists are prohibitively long; therefore, the SCBA must actively coordinate with the administration to rapidly construct additional chamber blocks in the Supreme Court vicinity. Moreover, there must be a policy for reallocation of chamber left vacant/unused after a period of allotment.

3) Medical insurance

I strongly advocate for expanding the SCBA's recently proposed LIC Group Term Insurance scheme. We must ensure comprehensive, cashless health and life insurance policies for all active members and their families, waiving premiums for those earning under fifteen lakhs annually, thereby safeguarding advocates against severe financial distress during medical emergencies.

4) Court infrastructure

The Supreme Court needs modernized, tech-enabled infrastructure. My vision includes expanding high-speed Wi-Fi access, making the e-filing centers more streamlined. The court infrastructure requires better consultation rooms and weather friendly waiting areas for advocates. The court sequence system should be more streamlined to assist advocates in better management of cases throughout the day. We must also prioritize clean sanitation facilities, larger cafeteria spaces, better food quality and improved parking arrangements to ensure a dignified, efficient working environment for all practicing advocates.

5) Young lawyer support

Addressing the cognitive overload of junior advocates is crucial. I support implementing the Bar Council's recommended minimum stipend for junior advocates. Additionally, we must actively establish a Young Lawyers' Professional Assistance Fund and expand mentorship programs to ensure that first-generation lawyers can successfully sustain and grow their early litigation practice. Moreover, the SCBA must organize more social events to allow the junior advocates to engage with fellow experienced members of the Bar.

Your opinion on the Selection & Appointment of Judges *What is your stance on the current Collegium System versus alternative models (e.g., Judicial Appointments Commission with Bar representation)? What should be the correct, transparent method for selecting Supreme Court and High Court judges? (50 words)*

While the collegium system preserves judicial independence, however the current system can be more transparent. A reformed model akin to a Judicial Appointments Commission is necessary to introduce structured criteria and accountability. Crucially, the Supreme Court Bar must have formal representation in the consultative process to ensure diverse, fair, and meritocratic judicial elevations.
